Waukesha South kicks off concert series

WAUKESHA – The music program at Waukesha South High School presented the season opener for its Children's Concert Series on Oct. 22 as the bands, choir and orchestra performed in Waukesha South's auditorium. Highlighting the 50th anniversary of "Psycho," music, movie clips, drama and dance provided a not-so-scary tribute to the legacy of Alfred Hitchcock.

In addition to hearing music in the concert hall, 120 younger students took part in pre-concert activities to enhance their learning. Waukesha South child-care students selected age-appropriate literature and read theme-related stories to students in classrooms throughout the high school prior to the concert.
